## Zambia delegation

A parliamentary delegation led by Speaker of the National Assembly of the Republic of Zambia Nelly Butete Mutti, called on Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla at the Parliament House Complex here on Thursday. Welcoming the delegation, Birla congratulated Mutti on being elected the first woman Speaker of the National Assembly of Zambia. Referring to India as the mother of democracy, the Speaker said that India is the largest and most vibrant democracy in the world where more than 90 crore voters elect 545 Members of the Lok Sabha.

He said that in the House, public representatives give voice to the hopes, aspirations and concerns of the people. Speaking on India's development journey, Birla said that democracy has contributed immensely in the nation's progress. He remarked that in the last seven decades, the Parliament of India has made

several socially and economically progressive laws in order to solve the problems of different sections of society.

Referring to the extensive Committee system in the larger Indian parliamentary system, Birla said that the legislature is empowered due to the Committee system, leading to higher accountability and transparency; thereby strengthening parliamentary oversight. Describing bilateral relations between India and Zambia as being historically based on mutual and multifaceted cooperation, the Speaker said that in the 21st century the friendly relations between the two countries have been strengthened and expanded to several new areas of cooperation.

Referring to India as the fastest growing economy in the world, Birla expressed joy that bilateral trade and investment between India and Zambia is also growing steadily. Mentioning

India's G-20 presidency, Birla said that the G-20 is a major forum for international economic cooperation and India intends to use this forum to address the important issues of developing nations and the Global South. In this context, he added that this year India is also organizing the P-20 Conference.

The Speaker informed that as per the concept of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam', India sees the whole world as one family and therefore this year, the theme of G-20 is 'One Earth, One Family, One Future'. He added that India would seek effective resolution of major global affairs through this forum and was looking forward to Zambia's active cooperation in this direction. Describing parliamentary institutions as an important pillar of democratic governance, Birla stressed on regular dialogue between the two countries.

## BJP to contest all 60 seats in Meghalaya Assembly

Shillong, Feb 3: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Thursday announced its candidates for all the 60 Assembly constituencies in Meghalaya where election is scheduled to be held on February 27.

Unlike in the previous elections, this is for the first time that the saffron party is fielding its candidates in all the 60 Assembly constituencies in the state. In 2018 assembly elections, the BJP contested in 47 seats but won only two seats.

"Keeping in view the sentiments of the people, for the first time, our

leadership has decided to contest on all 60 seats in Meghalaya with the tagline 'Empower Meghalaya'. The people of Meghalaya are fed up with corruption and the slow pace of development in their state. The people are suffering due to poor rural roads, power cuts for long hours and lack of basic facilities," Sinha said, adding that central schemes are not being implemented in the state. "BJP national secretary Rituraj Sinha said,

"People trust that Prime Minister Modi can give corruption-free,

fast-track development," the BJP leader said.

The saffron party which is confident of increasing its tally in the State Assembly is fielding a former militant leader-turned politician Bernard N. Marak against Chief Minister Conrad Sangma in South Tura constituency.

Marak was arrested in a case a few months back on various criminal charges but was released on bail by the court later.

The list also includes Arts and Culture Minister Sanbor Shullai representing South

Shillong constituency and former Health and Family Welfare Minister, Alexander Laloo Hek from Pynthormukhrah constituency. State Party's president Ernest Mawrie will contest from West Shillong seat.

Two former Assembly Speakers? Elstone D Marak and Martin Dango were allotted party tickets. Initially, Dango was the official candidate of the NPP from Ranikor assembly seat, but quit the Conrad Sangma-led party following a 'secret political meet' with Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma.

Another prominent leader Himalaya Muktan Shangliang who shifted allegiance to the BJP from the TMC, has been given nomination to contest from Mawsynram constituency.

Moreover, two former NPP legislators - Benedict R Marak and Ferlin Sangma - were also given party tickets to contest from Raksamgere and Selsella assembly seat. In the list there are also six women candidates including the former NPP legislator Ferlin. The other women candidates include: Bitty Jyrwa (Mawkyrwat), Darikmen L Marhillong (Mawthadraishan), Arena Hynniewta (Shella), Riya Sangma (Jirang) and Marian Maring (Nongpoh). Former IPS officer Mariahom Kharkrang will contest from North Shillong.

# Vibration disturbance led to SSLV failure: ISRO

## Detailed analysis submitted to space organisation

Chennai, Feb 3:

A vibration disturbance for a short duration during the separation of the Second Stage led to the failure of the maiden developmental flight of the Small Satellite Launch Vehicle (SSLV-D1) in August last year, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) said on Thursday.

This was revealed in Failure Analysis report of SSLV-D1 Mission submitted to the ISRO. The ISRO said the Failure Analysis Committee, which went into the failure of the first SSLV mission, said detailed analysis of the flight events and observations ranging from countdown, lift-off, propulsion performance, stage separations and satellite injection revealed that there was a vibration disturbance for a short duration on the Equipment Bay (EB) deck during the Second Stage (SS2) separation, that affected the Inertial Navigation System (INS), resulting in declaring the sensors faulty by the logic



in Fault Detection & Isolation (FDI) software.

It said SSLV is designed to be affordable and amenable to industry production and will function as a launch-on-demand platform for mini, micro or nano satellites.

It is a three-stage vehicle with all solid propulsion stages and liquid propulsion-based Velocity Trimming Module (VTM) as the terminal stage.

The launcher also targets many novel features including low turn around time, flexibility in accommodating multiple satellites, launch-on-demand,

minimal launch infrastructure requirements, etc.

The first developmental flight of SSLV lifted off from Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) on August 7, 2022 at 0918 hrs. The objective of the mission (SSLV-D1/EOS-02) was to inject EOS-02 satellite of ISRO into a circular orbit of 356.2 km with an inclination of 37.21 deg.

Azaadisat, a student satellite was also accommodated in the mission, authorised by IN-SPACe.

However, the spacecraft were injected into a highly elliptical unstable

orbit due to a shortfall in velocity, leading to their decay and deorbiting immediately, in spite of normal performance of all solid propulsion stages. The orbit achieved was 360.56 km x 75.66 km with an inclination of 36.56 deg.

Initial investigations with the flight data indicated that the lift-off of SSLV-D1 was normal along with normal performance of all solid propulsion stages.

However, the mission could not be achieved due to an anomaly during the SS2 separation, which triggered a mission salvage mode (which is a procedure adopted to attempt minimum stabilized orbital conditions for the spacecraft in case of an anomaly in the vehicle system).

**Second flight soon**

Meanwhile, ISRO also said the second developmental flight of SSLV (SSLV-D2/EOS-07 Mission) is scheduled in the first quarter of 2023. SSLV-D2 and will launch a total payload

mass of about 334 kg, including the EOS-07 satellite and two co-passenger satellites. The objective of development missions is to prove the launch vehicle design and architecture and to bring out any residual unknowns not identified in the qualifications tests and analysis during its development journey.

SSLV-D1 mission demonstrated the satisfactory integrated performance of SSLV in all its systems including its flight through the aerodynamic regime, which is an accomplishment by itself.

Considering the clear identification of the cause of the flight anomaly and suggested corrective actions, the next development flight (SSLV-D2) is planned to be executed complying to the recommendations, its satisfactory implementation, review and approval by the authorized committees, ISRO said.

## Finland will join NATO with Sweden, vows Finnish PM

Stockholm, Feb 3: Finland remains determined to join the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (NATO) together with Sweden, visiting Prime Minister Sanna Marin said when she met her Swedish counterpart here on

Thursday. They also discussed Sweden's current Presidency of the Council of the European Union (EU) and the security situation.

"Last spring, we started our common path to join NATO. This journey must be made hand in hand and in common accord, just like we started it," Marin said in a joint press conference with Sweden's Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson.

Marin's remark came three days after Turkiye's foreign minister said that his country could evaluate Finland's NATO bid separately from Sweden's to distinguish "between a problematic country and a less problematic one." The issue became no less topical after Finnish newspaper Itä-Sanomat reported on the result of a poll showing that the majority of Finns were ready to join NATO without Sweden, Swedish Television

(SVT) reported on Thursday.

Asked by a reporter about the result of the poll, Marin reiterated that Finland intends to join NATO together with Sweden.

"I think it is very

important that we today send a very clear message: Finland and Sweden applied together, and it is in everybody's interest that we join NATO together," Marin said.
